The Rapid Response Vehicle is proving to be a real asset for the volunteer crewmen who have it to use when they are on duty. One of the local crewmen Steve Campbell, believes that volunteering gives a very balanced perspective on life, and is really pleased that the team has a dedicated vehicle which is swapped through the squad duty roster. "We are now waiting on our training in the use of lights and

sirens which will enable us to use the vehicle even more effectively. Using the lights and sirens does not mean we can speed but it does give us the ability to get to a job a lot quicker than in our personal vehicles because the traffic will move aside to let us through. The critical time in the circle of response is 10 minutes and with your personal emergency kit in the boot you are ready to go as soon as you are paged. We also need to ensure that we have the right equipment to safely assist in saving lives." The Trust has about 20 regular volunteer crewmen at any given time and each is a highly trained specialist in their role and the key to success is working well in the team that is involved in each mission.
