PIRONGIA BOXING DAY RACES



The Boxing Day Races in Pirongia saw a large crowd enjoy a great day out in brilliant sunshine. The sixth race on the card was the McFall Fuel Maiden run over about 1600 metres. The eight horse race saw the Graeme & Debbie Rogerson trained 'Contestant' come from behind to take line honours in a closely contested final few metres. The action packed day saw trotting; the galloping thunder of the Clydesdales; two races with ponies and young mounts trotting; saddle handicap trots; and the feature race the Molly Dawson Light Fingers Memorial.

The Alexandra Racing Club was founded in 1866 and the 2015 event at the Pirongia Golf Club was the 145th Annual Meeting. Boxing Day 2016 will mark the 150th Anniversary of the oldest Racing Club in New Zealand. ENVIRONMENT IMPORTANT FOR NZ BUSINESSES

New Zealand businesses priorities for corporate social responsibility contrast with those of our Australian neighbours.
